


# A VERY brief history of housing in Cincinnati

- U.S. housed the homeless after the Great Depression by building housing (Public Housing Authorities)
- White flight from urban communities
- Housing is a private market asset
- Urban revitalization Gentrification
- Growing hidden need for more affordable housing
- Housing-induced recession of 2008-09
- By 2014 a 40,000 unit gap in Hamilton County
- At EVERY point inequity and racism drive markets and decision-making

#### HAMILTON COUNTY HOUSING PATTERNS




Change in low cost rental units




# Cost burdened households

- Over 100,000
  households in Hamilton
  County paying over 30%
  of their income for
  housing
- Cost burden most severe for households making only 30% of AMI
  - **44,500** households
    - 17,000 Family households
    - 10,000 Senior households

• The top 5 jobs in the Cincinnati region do not pay enough to




## **Current State of Affairs**
